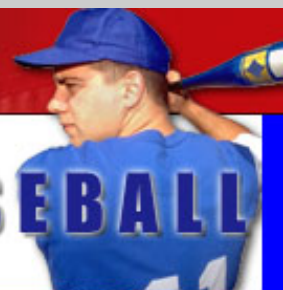

Let's get started. Be sure to hit a home run!



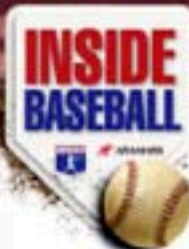

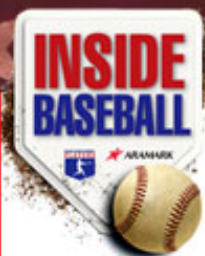

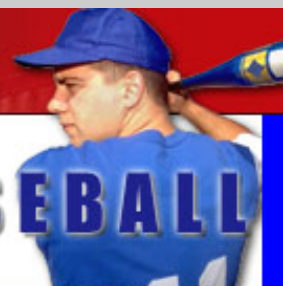
Draw a line connecting the item to the correct position on the Food Pyramid.

Getting Ready for the Game

It takes many people behind-the-scenes to get PNC Park ready for each Pirates game. The grass needs to be mowed, the seats need to be cleaned and the floors must be mopped. Can you find out just how much work needs to get done?

1. Joe the Janitor has to mow the grass on the field at PNC Park. If he mows down the left field line 338 feet and then mows down the center field line 410 feet, how many feet of grass will he have mowed?

2. There are 55,600 seats at PNC Park. Joe needs to clean the chewing gum off each seat before the next game. If he cleans half of those seats today, how many will he have to finish tomorrow?

3. Now, Joe must make sure that there is soap in all the bathrooms. If PNC Park has 150 bathrooms and only 45 have soap, in how many bathrooms does Joe need to put soap?

4. Joe has been working hard all day but he still has to mop the floors in front of the food stands. There are 23 food stands, and Joe mopped 5. How many more need to be cleaned?

5. Finally, Joe needs to take out all the trash before the next game starts. If Joe filled 120 garbage bags and he only has time to take out one quarter ($1/4$) of those bags, how many bags will be thrown out today?

Batter up! Here are some bonus questions for grades 4 and 5!

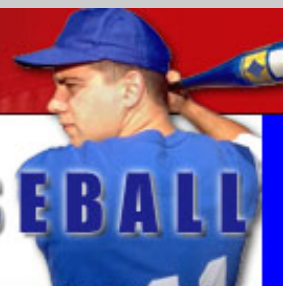
1. If it takes Joe 10 minutes to take out 20 garbage bags, how many hours would it take Joe to remove 1,680 garbage bags?

2. Joe works very hard at the ballpark. He needs to take breaks throughout the day to eat a healthy lunch and keep his energy high. If he took a break from 9:45 a.m. until 10:15 a.m. and then another at 1:25 p.m. until 2:15 p.m., for how many minutes did Joe take a break today?

3. Joe must wash the dirty rags everyday. He uses 1 box of laundry detergent each week. How many boxes of detergent does he use in a 175-day baseball season?

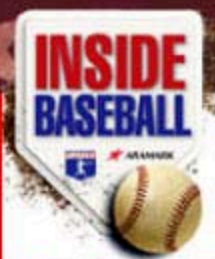
Winning on the Field, Winning in the Community
